












If you do leave your seat during a break in play please remain at the bottom of the stairs for a stoppage in play before returning. The stewards will be there to advise you of this.

Of the three IIHF Global Hockey Forum topics - Women's, Marketing, and Development – it was Development that focused mostly on the action on the ice, even though Xs and Os were mostly absent there as well. Development focused on talent, transformational leader- though research shows that scouting too early doesn't ship, and selection.

"Our job is to provide opportunities and find ways of improving the environment in which our athlete's and coaches operate," says Kalle Valiaho, IIHF Development Manager for Europe and Africa.

"At the Global Hockey Forum we were able to provide various insights on how to build a structure that keeps players in the game. Our speakers shared the latest findings from their research and explained how to implement them in practice."

When those experts meet a curious audience, such as the one in Nice, France, one plus one becomes three.

"At events like this, the expertise is not on the stage – it's in the audience. Use these connections, get together. Find people in your situation, get advice from people who have been there before you. The collective wisdom in this room is far greater than anything I can offer. We're the catalyst for you to go and make those connections," said John O'Sullivan, Founder of the Changing the Game Project.

No child picks up hockey to become a professional player. They fall in love with the fastest game on earth because it's challenging, fun, and makes them happy. Too often that is forgotten in organized sports. These days, youth sports are not only a business—it's a huge business, said Tom Farrey, founder and executive director of the Aspen Institute's Sports & Society Program, and author of Game On: The All-American Race to Make Champions of Our Children.

"The youth sports industry is worth \$40 billion, which is twice as much money as is flowing through the NF, the richest sports league in the world, and six times as much as is flowing through the NHL," he told IIHF.com.

"What do children want out of a sport experience? They want to challenge themselves with friends, have funeven win—but that's not the most important thing. If you let kids design sport environments, they usually look a lot different from what adults would do. Do you think kids put all the best players on one team? No, they don't. Why? That's boring," he added.

Once the game is on, another thing adults often bring into sports is talent scouting. A talented kid is recruited to another team, given more and better coaching, even work very well.

John Lind, Director of Research & Education at the Swedish Ice Hockey Association, drove that point home by showing how late bloomers make up 40 percent of Swedish NHLers, even though their share in the under-16 national team was only 19 percent.

Bio-banding – a method of grouping players based on their maturity rather than chronological age - is one way to level the playing field, so that maturity isn't mistaken for greater talent.

Whatever talent is, we're not very good at finding it, because talent is a complicated and complex phenomenon that can't be distilled into a single indicator or measure, noted Joe Baker, Tanenbaum Research Chair in Sport Science, Data Modeling, and Sport Analytics at the University of Toronto. Instead, it's a mixture of different physical, mental, psychological, and cognitive varia-

"Athletes who get selected are offered developmental advantages over their peers," Baker said, echoing Lind. "Evidence indicates that if we allow our system to have multiple entry points, athletes can enter later and still be successful."


On the other hand, Associate Professor Billy Adamsen of Zealand Academy of Technology and Business in Denmark said that labeling athletes talented can reduce persistence and proactive learning behavior.

"The most important thing is to see the players thrive. Sometimes we only see the unicoms, but my proudest moments as a coach have come with kids who make the A team after having been cut first. They learn that if they invest in themselves, if they do the work, good things happen. That's not a hockey lesson – it's a life lesson," O'Sullivan says.

"The number one thing that makes a great coach is caring. They love their players not just as hockey players but as human beings. When you invest in the human being, you get better hockey players. Yes, you have to know the Xs and Os, but relationship skills are the key to everything.

Connor McDavid said his new contract with the Edmonton Oilers is about putting the team first in took nearly everyone by surprise. the guest to win the Stanley Cup.

The Oilers captain took his time deciding his future beyond this season and settled on a direction he felt was best for team success, signing a two-year, \$25 million contract on Monday that begins with the 2026-27 season.

With an average annual value of \$12.5 million, it is a price tag far below what is considered market value for the center.

"I obviously said I was committed to winning here and I meant that when I said that, and two years makes a lot of sense," McDavid said Tuesday. "It gives us a chance to continue chasing down what we've been chasing down here with the core guys we have in here and we have a little bit of money to work with too. I think the deal makes sense to both sides."

The contract keeps Edmonton's championship window open for at least another three seasons and affords the Oilers space under the NHL salary cap to make adjustments to the roster if neces-

Edmonton made it to the Stanley Cup Final the past two seasons, losing to the Florida Panthers on both occasions, and is again considered a championship contender.

"It gives the core guys that have been here a really long time and guys in this room that have come here, a chance to be a part of something special," McDavid said of the two-year term. "It gives us a chance to play that out and that's important to me, obviously."

McDavid is in the last season of an eight-year, \$100 million contract (\$12.5 million AAV) he signed July 5, 2017.

Though there was an expectation that the 28vear-old would sign a shorter-term deal with his next contract, the fact that he didn't get a raise

"I guess it's a unique situation," McDavid said. "We weren't going to sign a long-term deal, so two years at that number makes a lot of sense. It gives us a chance to extend our window here in Edmonton. [My dog] Lenny is not going to go hungry with that money, so we'll be fine. It's about winning and that's always what I preached. and I think this deal gives both sides what we're looking for."

McDavid has accomplished nearly everything there is to achieve individually since entering the League in 2015-16 after being selected No. 1 by the Oilers in the 2015 NHL Draft.

He has won the Hart Trophy as the NHL's most valuable player three times (2016-17, 2020-21, 2022-23); the Ted Lindsay Award as most outstanding player, as voted by the NHL Players Association, four times (2016-17, 2017-18, 2020-21, 2022-23); and the Art Ross Trophy as the NHL's leading scorer five times (2016-17, 2017-18, 2020-21, 2021-22, 2022-23). He also won the Conn Smythe Trophy as MVP of the Stanley Cup Playoffs in 2024 despite Edmonton losing the Cup Final in seven games.

All that's left for him is to help bring the Stanley Cup back to Edmonton for the first time since

"Obviously the city and the fans are important to us and we want to win here," McDavid said. "We want to bring it back here and make our city proud. But it's mostly for the guys in this room. We've been through a lot together and to see it through together is important.

"I think everybody understands the situation in this room and the situation this organization is in. We want to win. If it lends urgency, that's a good byproduct."

Four questions to be answered

The clock is ticking. There are just over four months until the start of the 2026 Olympic men's hockey tournament. But the NHL season is already underway. And early-season performances Sometimes a change of NHL scenery can spark in the world's top pro league can potentially shape outcomes in Milan in February.

So let's check out some key NHL storylines to watch as we await the thrilling return of NHLers to the Olympics for the first time since 2014.

1) Who will emerge as Canada's #1 goalie?

Jordan Binnington, the longtime St. Louis Blues starter and a two-time IIHF Ice Hockey World Championship participant, appears to have the inside track. The 32-year-old shone in Canada's 3-2 overtime win over the archrival U.S. in the 4 Nations Cup.

That said, this is not 2002, when the Canadians brought a Hockey Hall of Fame-contending trio of Martin Brodeur, Curtis Joseph, and Ed Belfour. Binnington is not a lock. The Hockey Canada braintrust will also look closely at the likes of Adin Hill (Vegas Golden Knights), Logan Thompson (Washington Capitals), and Samuel Montembeault (Montreal Canadiens) - the latter backstopped Canada to gold at the 2023 Worlds in Tampere. The door remains open for someone to steal the top job.

2) Which 2014 NHL Olympians will go to Milan?

Twelve years is an eternity in hockey. Yet some NHL stars who played in Sochi are still going strong. Canada announced Sidney Crosby among its first six choices for 2026. Switzerland did the same with Roman Josi and Nino Niederreiter. Czechia's Ondrej Palat and Radko Gudas also received that honour.

Defenceman Drew Doughty, if healthy and excelling at age 35, could join Crosby in Milan. Mikael Granlund – one of Finland's top game-breakers with World Championship gold from 2011 and 2022 - should get another chance to shine at age 33. The list of potential 2014 returnees is surprisingly long.

3) Will stars in new NHL homes get turbocharged?

success on Olympic ice.

Will Mitch Marner take his two-way game to new heights this year? If so, the former Toronto Maple Leaf and newest Vegas Golden Knights star could be impactful for Canada in Milan. How about Matias Maccelli, the nifty Finn who'll try to fill the gap left playmaking-wise after Marner's departure from Toronto? The 24-year-old, traded by the Utah Mammoth in June, could be a bigger factor than expected for Suomi in February.

And if the Danes want to pull off a massive Olympic upset – similar to their 2-1 World Championship quarter-final ouster of Canada on home ice in Herning this year – they'll need big-time help from Nikolaj Ehlers again. The ex-Winnipeg Jets ace may benefit from an expanded role with the Carolina Hurricanes in 2025-26.

4) Can Finland find a Barkov substitute?

Nobody said it would be easy for the Finns to defend their historic 2022 Olympic title. But their odds looked far better with Florida Panthers captain Aleksander Barkov, a 2014 Olympic bronze medalist who has since won two Stanley Cups and three Selke Trophies. Since the towering centre suffered a pre-season knee injury, Finnish coach Antti Pennanen must decide how best to address this gaping void, as you can't really "replace" the unique Barkov.

Budding Panthers star Anton Lundell – nicknamed "Baby Barkov" - could step up here. Playmaking Carolina pivot Sebastian Aho, who received Selke votes last season, is also strong on the draw and solid defensively. And Dallas Stars superstar Mikko Rantanen, who entered the Conn Smythe Trophy conversation during the 2025 playoffs, will look to pick up the slack as well. Of course, the Finns thrive on being underestimated. Stav tuned.
