Two weeks ago we had a great advert for the game of ice hockey when the Pirates came to the Arena. A sixth goal at 58:07 was just reward for the overall performance once the guys found their way past a resolute Pirates netminder. For once it wasn't the usual suspects who led the scoring so hats off to Sean Stewart who netted four times.

It was good to see Jonnie Livingston get his first taste of S N L hockey coming on for Ben at 55:26 and making the most of his chance with a couple of saves. Another first for the season was that Chad was coach for the game with Steven taking a back seat. Yet another first of the season was Ben Keddie getting an assist.

The following night we travelled to Dundee in the first leg of the Scottish Cup semi-final and despite being six regulars not icing we lost out by the odd goal in eleven with Joe scoring a treble and Kyle and Conner adding to the score. It's all to play for in the second leg here on the 27th.

In the nights other semi Warriors and Lynx shared eight goals at Whitley.

How Fast Does a Puck Travel ?

When watching a hockey game, you may wonder how fast those pucks are actually travelling. It's not uncommon for players to shoot the puck at speeds of over 100 miles per hour – that's faster than some cars on the Motorway!

The speed of a shot can depend on many factors, including the player's strength and technique, as well as the stick and puck used. On average, a professional ice hockey puck travels between 70-100 miles per hour (mph). Several different factors influence the speed of the puck. Firstly, the strength and type of the hockey stick a player uses can affect their shot power and therefore contribute to the overall speed of the puck. A lighter wood, composite, or hybrid materials cross-checked to maximize efficiency with advanced engineering and manufacturing techniques affect the weight, strength, and overall design in stimulating quicker toe drags, snap-shots, backhand, turnovers, slapshots producing faster top-end puck speeds. Secondly, the game situation also plays a part. Shots taken on power-plays have more significant open windows as fewer opponents are on defence and fewer shank blocks to obstruct the net. Goalies need broader coverage because of this time stretching scenarios, and will subsequently be less likely to make a save when the shot is launched at full velocity.

The speed of the puck plays a central role in ice hockey gameplay. It determines how hard players need to shoot, what formation the team utilizes on power-plays break-ins and rapid-fire shots they can take while avoiding defenders adding multiple rebounds. Reaching high speeds contributes significantly to the game and its atmosphere, ultimately solidifying its essence as one of the fastest sports ever played today! From evaluating various equipment types to studying distinct situational scenarios, tools used for measuring average speeds point out drastically varying measurement results.

What is the Interference penalty in Hockey ?

Interference occurs when a player uses their body, stick, or any other object to impede the progress of an opponent who does not have possession of the puck. It can also occur when a player physically blocks the path of another player without attempting to legally play the puck. In hockey, interference is a penalty called when a player deliberately blocks or obstructs an opposing player from performing their duties on the ice. Essentially, it happens when one player interferes with another player's opportunity to move freely without the puck.

Interference can happen in several ways on the ice. One common type of interference occurs when players actively block opponents or use physical force to interfere with their movement and progress on the ice. Another example can be seen when a player stands between the opponent and the goal while not playing the puck directly.

Neglecting interference rules also goes against the fundamental principles of sportsmanship and respect for other players. Interference negatively impacts the flow and dynamic of the game. It slows down gameplay and leads to irregular stopping points throughout matches. This disruption often delays goals and keeps plays from happening naturally, which cheapens the overall quality of the match for everyone involved- fans, coaches, and players alike. With fewer natural plays occurring during the game, there is less excitement generated on behalf of supporters.

Additionally, it's not uncommon for interference tactics to cause physical harm or injury to opposing players. Hockey is a contact sport, but referees must ensure that hits and plays remain within safe limits for everyone on the rink. Interference penalties are one way to keep play-

ers safe during gameplay.

Faceoffs are a crucial part of any hockey game. During a faceoff, players from opposing teams line up against each other and try to win control of the puck as it's dropped in-between them by the official. However, interference can occur during faceoffs when a player tries to gain an unfair advantage over their opponent. For example, if a player interferes with or impedes their opponent's ability to gain possession of the puck during a faceoff, that player may be penalized for interference.

Interference can also occur when a player is not in possession of the puck. This often happens when two players are racing towards the puck, but one player gets obstructed or impeded by another player, preventing them from getting to the puck. When this happens, the obstructing player may be called for interference even though they don't have the puck themselves.

Impeding the progress of another player is another way that interference may take place. This can happen when a player intentionally or unintentionally trips, hooks, holds, shoves, or obstructs another player from moving freely on the ice. Such actions impede the opposing player's movement and impact their playability which can lead to serious injuries, so they're heavily frowned upon and considered unsportsmanlike conduct in hockey. Finally, interference also occurs when a player screens another player. This means that a player is positioned directly in front of an opposing team's goalie - blocking their line of sight just before the puck arrives. This makes it difficult for the goalie to see and defend against the incoming shot, resulting in an unfair advantage for the team with the screened player.

Fans of the Elite League Capitals May Remember PK Subban

If you were a fan of the Capitals Elite League team you may remember a defenceman of the Hamilton Bulldogs who won the Gardner Cup here at Murrayfield.

Defenceman PK Subban, who was voted MoM in the Semi and Final, has gone on to make a great career for himself.

Before playing in the NHL, Subban represented Canada at the 2008 World Junior Championships held in Pardubice and Liberec, Czech Republic. He played a crucial role in leading Canada to a gold medal victory over Sweden, recording five points (two goals, three assists) in seven games during the tournament. Subban was drafted 43rd overall by his hometown team, the Montreal Canadiens, in the second round of the 2007 NHL Entry Draft. He made his NHL debut on February 20, 2010, against the Philadelphia Flyers. Over time he became one of their star players, playing an integral role in reaching the Eastern Conference Finals during the 2009-10 playoffs and being nominated for the Calder Memorial Trophy as the NHL's rookie of the year the same season.

In the 2014-15 season, Subban led the Canadiens to their first Atlantic Division title since its creation in 1998-99. He also received the James Norris Memorial Trophy that season, symbolizing him as the best defenceman in the NHL. However, his tenure in Montreal came to an abrupt end when he was traded to Nashville Predators in June 2016.

Subban represented Canada at the 2014 Winter Olympics held in Sochi, Russia. He helped lead Canada to the gold medal with his exceptional performance during the tournament. Although he was not a regular on the roster, he stepped up when needed and contributed significantly to Canada's success.

In what might have been considered a colossal trade, Montreal Canadiens exchanged Subban to Nashville Predators for Shea Weber. Subban played for the Predators for three seasons, starting in 2016-17 until 2018-19. In his first season, he helped lead the team to the Stanley Cup Final but, unfortunately, unsuccessfully lost out to the Pittsburgh Penguins in six games.

The 2017-18 campaign was Subban's most productive season with

the Predators. He scored 16 goals and added 43 assists in 82 games, earning himself an invite to the All-Star Game and finishing top-10 in Norris Trophy voting.

In June 2019, Nashville traded Subban to the New Jersey Devils for a pair of second-round draft picks. Unfortunately, injuries prevented him from playing to his full potential during his first season with the Devils (2019-20).

Subban has also represented Team Canada on various occasions, most notably at the Winter Olympics where he won a gold medal in 2014 held in Sochi, Russia.

He finished the tournament with one goal and two assists while averaging around 12 minutes of ice time per game. His impressive work on the ice earned him a gold medal and cemented his place as one of Canada's greatest hockey players.

Subban recorded 38 points (11 goals, 27 assists) in just 42 games during the shortened season due to the lockout. He also led all NHL defencemen with 26 power-play points, proving his dominance on the ice and making him worthy of the Norris Trophy that year.

Subban was one of those rare players who had a significant impact without accumulating many points on the scoreboard because his defensive skills were just as impressive as his offensive skills. For example, in the 2015 playoffs against Ottawa Senators, he scored only seven points in 12 games but also provided excellent defence, which resulted in him holding onto a +8 plus/minus rating (the highest among all Habs defencemen).

PK Subban is well-known for his charitable work and community outreach. He has donated millions to the Montreal Children's Hospital, created the BlueLine Buddies program in Nashville to build relationships between police and underprivileged youth, and has been an advocate for LGBTQ+ rights.

PK retired from professional hockey on Sept. 20th 2022 with a net worth estimated to be around \$80 million. He has earned this wealth through his NHL career, endorsements with companies like Adidas, Bridgestone, and Gatorade, and various business ventures, including a production company and investment in a real estate development. He is now a broadcast analyst for
